



A Community First Responder is trained to provide an initial assessment of a patient's condition and where appropriate, use their emergency skills and knowledge to initiate care and treatment.

FREE Basic Life Support Courses – Could you save a life?

Penicuik Community First Responders run a number of Basic Life Support courses.

A course lasts around two hours is free to attend and you'll learn key life saving skills including: dealing with an unconscious person; the signs and symptoms of a heart attack; recognising a cardiac arrest and performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); dealing with choking and serious bleeding along with a demonstration on how to use a defibrillator.

Penicuik Community First Responders have be running since October 2005. Now, by 2008 we will have responded to over 700 people in Penicuik Who have called 999 in need of help.

When you dial 999 for an ambulance in Peniculk, the Scottish Ambulance Service will activate a First Responder (if appropriate) to bridge the gap before the Ambulance Paramedic arrives. Responders will work only within the town of Peniculk and will respond to calls for emergency help relating to specific types of emergencies, e.g. chest pains or suspected heart attacks.



Not very many people know what to do in a real life-threatening emergency such as a Cardiac Arrest. These skills are simple to learn and can save lives.














A Heartfelt Thank You
